## Feed the birds!

The raucous squawking of migrating Pink-footed Geese is the annual signal to clean and refill our garden birdfeeders.

Most offer just seed mixes or peanuts. These are fine but try Sunflower and Niger seeds as these may attract Great-spotted Woodpecker and Goldfinch. Up to five species of tit (Blue, Great, Coal, Marsh and Long-tailed) can be expected to vie feverishly for the Sunflower seeds and, as the weather gets colder, one may see Siskin and Redpoll on the Niger seed.

Fatballs are a must as they are an important source of energy during the winter months. The falling 'litter' beneath these is very attractive to Blackbird, Chaffinch and, if you are lucky, Brambling.

As well as the above, it is worthwhile having a bird-table. The food presented thereon, including suet pellets, is more accessible to species less adept at clinging to the wire frames of some feeders. Your table will hence attract most of the finches, Robin, Dunnock and perhaps even a Nuthatch.

The Perch - whisperer.
