News from Syderstone Parish Council

The past few months have been all about speed and hopefully in the future less of it! By now we're sure you will have noticed the three sets of village gates on Docking Road, Mill Lane and Creake Road. Responding to parishioners' concerns about vehicles speeding through the village, Sally Bettison from NCC's Highways Dept, took a walk with several councillors and our parish clerk around the village to see what could be done. It was agreed that the three sets of gates could be installed (incorporating a Syderstone sign on the Creake Road gate where there wasn't one). To fund the cost the Parish Council paid part, this was match funded by NCC's "Parish Partnership" scheme for local highway improvements and a donation from our County Councillor Michael Chenery.

The Parish Council also successfully applied for a grant from Norfolk Community Foundation (Jack's Lane Wind Farm Fund) to buy solar panels for the moveable speed signs, thus relieving a councillor from the onerous task of repeatedly removing and charging the failing batteries. Huge thanks to Mick Beauchamp for doing this for the past couple of years.

A letter was also sent to local farmers and contractors reminding them of the speed limit and the narrow width of parts of the village and this was met with a positive response.

It was not possible to have village gates on Ashside as there is no suitable place to install them but there are posts for the moveable speed signs to be used there in turn. The village Speedwatch is now up and running again under the care of Paul Welland. It could use a few more volunteers though – it takes about an hour, at a time to suit you, and is cancelled in bad weather! so if you can spare a little time now and then, Paul would love to hear from you on 01485 576249.

Following 20 emails and many phone calls, the Parish Council has finally placed a bin on the playing field which will be emptied by KLWNBC fortnightly. Huge thanks to Karen for her perseverance and thanks to Dave Daly for installing it. The other broken bins will be removed.

Hopefully by the time of the next newsletter we will be a little bit nearer to a return to normality at the conclusion of this rather unusual year!

NATURALLY SYDERSTONE

Nobody in the village could fail to see or hear our perfect commuters. Every day they travel without clogging up the roads. They don't pollute the streets with toxic fumes. And they add value to our lives. Look up, and enjoy.

If you weren't brought up in north Norfolk, you might remember your first encounters with pink-footed geese. Perhaps you marvelled at those V-shaped flocks, called skeins, laced across the sky? We still don't know why they fly in such formations, though scientists think it's to do with aerodynamics. The birds at the front of the V are buffeted by the wind more than the rest, so after a while, they drop back and their companions, which have been coasting in the slipstream, bear the brunt of the breeze.

Most often, we'll hear them before we see them. They're sopranos of the goose world – their cackling calls are higher-pitched than other geese. Their appearance is distinctive too, they don't look like your average farmyard goose. Spot their short necks and lighter parts close to their tail on an otherwise brown undercarriage. The name 'pink-foot' doesn't really help with identification – the colour of their legs can be hard to see in poor light.

Where are they going, and where have they been? Syderstone's morning arrivals have spent the night on the coast, quite possibly on the marshes at RSPB Snettisham or Holme Dunes and they've come inland to graze on anything green. But there's an even bigger journey ahead — they'll fly across the North Sea late this winter to breed on the tundra of Iceland, Greenland or Spitzbergen.

Britain has most of the world's population of wintering pink-feet and most are in Norfolk. Thousands of people come here every year to admire the goose flocks. And they're right on your doorstep.

Villager's Stories and Histories – have been collected since 2006. Present villagers told us their stories and donated photos, memorabilia and information on both their families and Syderstone, past and present.

And Lastly, the Gardening Corner

October, the start of the gardening year — why! This is the time of year when we make preparations for a successful growing season next year. In the veg garden, as crops finish, you can start digging little and often so that it doesn't become a major chore. If you are adding manure to your veg garden, avoid adding lime until the Spring and if you are adding lime, do it where brassicas are to be grown.

October/November is the month for planting garlic and overwintering onions – the most popular are Garlic – Provence Wight, Onion – Shakespeare and Shallot – Gold Gourmet Autumn.

In November, Broad beans and peas can be planted, the recommended variety is Aquadulce Claudia and if you want to try autumn peas – Douce Provence will give good results for sweetness.

We are now in the middle of the bulb planting season and narcissi need to go in as soon as possible in order for them to produce a good root system – for best results with tulips leave until the weather gets much cooler, even December is ideal.

And lastly, sit down, feet up by the log burner and read through your seed packets and plan for 2021.
